New Membership Sign Ups -

At the moment, the next date for new members to sign up is yet to be determined. If you know someone who is keen to join us please tell them to keep an eye out on our website. If you are a member of our FaceBook group, then keep an eye out for them and when it is posted please let them know ©.

They will need to bring their dog's vaccination certificate but **not** their dog. Our fees and forms are listed on our website at www.bdoc.com.au. If they can download the forms and fill them out before attending it would be appreciated.

Please note they do need to QR check in and be fully vaccinated if over the age of 18 years old.

We also have eftpos facilities, but a 2% surcharge (\$2) will be charged on top of the membership fees so payment needs to be either cash or eftpos.

Membership Renewals

July was the month for our membership renewal process. However, if you missed these days, you have the first 2 Sundays of August to complete your renewal.

After the 14th August you will need to pay the \$15 joining fee as well as your membership renewal fee.

The process will be as follows:

- Come to the Clubrooms with your dog's updated vaccination certificate
- If you have Dogs Victoria membership or a pension/student card please bring your card for any discount to be applied
- You will be given a Renewal Membership form already filled in
- Please check the form and make any corrections as needed
- Pay the renewal fee with the returned form, &
- The following Sunday a new beige card will be ready for you to collect and replace in your card holder.
