- We are so fortunate to have such a great band of willing and knowledgeable instructors who turn up every week to help train your dogs. We know that they have other commitments so sometimes are not available for a Sunday. Their replacement is just as dedicated and will be able to support you and your dog with your training. Please be prompt to, and attentive, in class so all members gain the most from their class each week. If there is something you are unsure of, just ask the instructor to explain. Each instructor is only too keen to help you.
- Ring Craft happens each week(instructor numbers permitting) for those handlers who
  are ready, or already, competing in obedience trials. It gives them one-on-one
  feedback about their handling and also gives their dog a chance to experience the ring
  environment. Come and watch and see where you could end up!

\*Flyball is heavily impacted by the weather in the preceding days and through winter it is unfortunately often unsafe to train.


Rally is dependant on Instructor availability. Keep an eye on our Facebook page to find out if training is on for both disciplines.

## Tricks Report

Well, despite the chilly Ballarat weather, the success of the BDOC tricks programs is really heating up!

The June tricks theme was Cooperative care 'tricks' - so using the methods we use to teach tricks (luring, shaping and capture) to teach our dogs to do things that make it easier to look after their health, or visit the vet. Some of our dogs showed their skills in filing their own nails, presenting their ears for a detailed inspection, or their tummies with legs held in the air. July went by in a flash amidst trial prep without a theme being mentioned! In August, we'll be working on "Keeping warm" - doing tricks with blankets, pillows, clothing etc.

It's great to see the camaraderie, support and assistance our members provide to each other. It is quite common to hear comments from other competitors at trials about how fantastic a showing Ballarat members put on at the trials they go to - a friendly team of handlers and their dogs cheer each other on, helping hold dogs and shift equipment, and then do quite well at presentations too! Congratulations to all our members for the way they represent the club - we're building a great reputation in the tricks community.

A special mention must go to Ellen Mucha and Bluemoon Kai, who achieved their Advanced trick dog title at Geelong on 23 July. Ellen and Kai are the first BDOC team to achieve this feat of the highest level in tricks. There are less than 10 dog/handler teams in Victoria who have achieved this title, and \*Ellen and Kai are the first non-Dancing With Dogs club team to do so. A big BDOC congratulations to them both for this impressive effort!rt.



August brings a quieter month for tricks trials, some of our members may choose to make the journey to Dandenong for the Newfoundland Club All Breeds trick trial but many will spend the month learning new tricks after gaining titles at Geelong. In September we have the Melbourne DWD club tricks trial at Bulla and the K9 Agility Club tricks trial at KCC Park... and in October, BDOC will host our second tricks trial here at Vic Park! It would be great to see some more members having fun with their dogs in the starter tricks classes at these events.
